The **Evaluation of Social Interaction** (ESI) is an observational assessment of a person's *quality of social interaction* during natural social exchanges with typical social partners.

The Evaluation of Social Interaction is a valid and reliable assessment:

- For clients 2½ years and above, including older adults.
- Appropriate for people of any diagnosis (include *well* or *at risk*).

By the end of an ESI training course, participants will be able to:

- Administer and score the ESI in a valid and reliable way.
- Interpret ESI results, including computer-generated reports.
- Write occupation-focused documentation using the ESI skill item taxonomy.
- Document occupation-centered client goals.
- Design occupation-centered interventions using ESI results.
- Compare two ESI observation results to measure change over time.

### **Rater Calibration Requirements**

Participants will view and score real *videotaped* and *live* ESI observations during the course and observe and score 10 people after the course within 3 months following the course.
